

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 161

and

Representative Bone

A RESOLUTION to continue the Select Joint Committee on Veterans Affairs.

WHEREAS, the Select Joint Committee on Veterans Affairs has endeavored to prudently examine the almost infinite variety of problems confronting Tennessee's veterans and to propose viable and humane solutions thereto; and

WHEREAS, during the course of its intensive study, the Select Joint Committee on Veterans Affairs has held public hearings, listening to and helping to solve problems that confront our veterans, including problems in the areas of veterans' preference in hiring and promotion in state government; improved employment opportunities for veterans; treatment for post-traumatic stress disorder syndrome for Vietnam veterans; and the ever-shrinking GI Bill for college-bound veterans; and

WHEREAS, the Committee has also examined the effects of federal legislation that has a negative impact on the expenditure of federal funds for veterans' health care; and

WHEREAS, the Committee has studied the rapidly declining number of gravesites available in National Veterans Cemeteries and has guided to passage sweeping legislation to establish Tennessee State Veterans Cemeteries under a federally sponsored grant program; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee State Veterans Cemetery Program provides a dignified final resting place for thousands of deserving veterans; and

WHEREAS, the Committee has closely monitored the administration and operation of Tennessee's State Veterans Homes to ensure that our veterans are given the best possible care in their golden years; and

WHEREAS, the Committee has also attempted to address the obstacles to civilian employment for officers and senior enlisted personnel of the United States Armed Forces who are no longer assigned to active duty as a result of the "downsizing" of our military; and

WHEREAS, the Committee has investigated ways and means to establish a system of re-entry to expeditiously assimilate federal military service alumni into productive civilian employment or self-employment opportunities; and

WHEREAS, although much has been accomplished by the Committee, much remains yet to be done; and

WHEREAS, the Select Joint Committee on Veterans Affairs is an invaluable asset to this General Assembly and Tennessee's veterans, and its mandate should be continued; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING, that in recognition of the unique needs of Tennessee's veterans, the Select Joint Committee on Veterans Affairs is hereby continued for the duration of the One Hundred Fifth General Assembly.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Select Joint Committee shall consist of eight (8) members of the House of Representatives and eight (8) members of the Senate, to be appointed by the respective Speakers.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that vacancies on the Committee shall be filled by the Speaker of the Senate or the Speaker of the House of Representatives, as appropriate.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all appropriate state agencies, including the Department of Veterans Affairs, shall provide assistance to the Committee upon request of the chair.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all legislative members of the Committee who are duly elected members of the General Assembly shall remain members of such committee for the duration of the One Hundred Fifth General Assembly.

BE IT FURTHER RESOVLED, that appropriate actions should be undertaken to timely advise the General Assembly concerning any findings and recommendations of the Committee.
