AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 55, Chapter 4, to authorize issuance of a Ronald McDonald House new specialty earmarked license plate.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 55-4-202(c)(7), is amended by adding the following as a new, appropriately designated subdivision:

() Ronald McDonald House;

SECTION 2. Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 55, Chapter 4, Part 2, is amended by adding the following as a new, appropriately designated section:

55-4-2__.

(a) An owner or lessee of a motor vehicle who is a resident of this state, upon complying with state motor vehicle laws relating to registration and licensing of motor vehicles and paying the regular fee applicable to the motor vehicle and the fee provided in § 55-4-203, shall be issued a Ronald McDonald House new specialty earmarked license plate for a motor vehicle authorized by § 55-4-210(c).

(b) The new specialty earmarked license plates authorized by this section shall be of an appropriate design or logo representative of the mission of the Ronald McDonald House. The plates shall be designed in consultation with the Ronald McDonald House.

(c) The funds produced from the sale of Ronald McDonald House new specialty earmarked license plates shall be allocated to the Ronald McDonald House, in accordance with § 55-4-215, and distributed to the Tennessee chapters of the Ronald McDonald House. The funds shall be used by the Tennessee chapters of the Ronald McDonald House to create, fund and support programs that further the organization's mission to improve the health, education, and well-being of children.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2012, the public welfare requiring it.
