A RESOLUTION to honor and commend Dr. Kriner Cash, Superintendent of Schools for Memphis City Schools.

WHEREAS, it is fitting that the members of this General Assembly should pause to specially recognize those outstanding professionals who have devoted their careers to providing the highest quality education for Tennessee's students; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Kriner Cash is one such estimable educator, who has distinguished himself as a professional of the greatest dedication, ability, and integrity; and

WHEREAS, a highly respected educator, Dr. Cash has provided dedicated leadership and astute guidance to Memphis City Schools as the Superintendent of Schools since 2008; and

WHEREAS, prior to his current position, he served as the chief of accountability and system-wide performance for the Miami-Dade County Public Schools in Florida and has also served as superintendent of Martha's Vineyard Public Schools in Massachusetts, as dean, director and professor at Howard University's School of Education, and as a department chair, director and professor at Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts; and

WHEREAS, in charge of Tennessee's largest school system, Dr. Cash's work in Memphis has focused on addressing what he calls systemic fault lines that hold students back, such as pre-K literacy, retention and over-age for grade, teacher effectiveness and college readiness; and

WHEREAS, under his leadership, Memphis won a seven-year, \$90 million grant to execute its teacher-effectiveness initiative and increased its graduation rate to a historic high of 72.6 percent. The district has also made achievement gains in elementary, middle and high school math, tenth-grade English and in fifth-, eighth- and eleventh-grade writing assessments; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Cash earned a doctor of education degree in cultural diversity and curriculum reform from the University of Massachusetts. He also holds a master's degree in administration and policy analysis from Stanford University and a bachelor's degree in political science from Princeton University; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Kriner Cash is an extremely talented and compassionate administrator who works assiduously to motivate Memphis' students to reach their full potential, both as scholars and as citizens; and
