WHEREAS, Iris's late husband was an avid supporter of her work at Head Start; he served as a special volunteer and Iris has a plaque in her living room in honor of his twenty years of outstanding service to the program; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Thompson is an active and devout member of her local Baptist church; and

WHEREAS, her numerous accomplishments aside, she is deeply devoted to her family and she always endeavors to remain true to family values of the highest order; and

WHEREAS, she is perhaps most proud of the love and companionship she shared for many blissful years with her husband, Billy, until his passing; and

WHEREAS, Iris Thompson is the proud matriarch of two daughters, Teresa Lowe and Kathy Bunch; four grandchildren, Josh Lowe, Amy Russell, Chris Byrge, and Boone Davidson; and five great-grandchildren, Blake and Bethany Lowe, Hayden and Kambrie Byrge, and Kateri Russell; and


WHEREAS, it is fitting that the members of this General Assembly should pause to specially recognize Tennessee's senior citizens; now, therefore,


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an appropriate copy of this resolution be prepared for presentation with this final clause omitted from such copy.
