## PRIVATE CHAPTER NO. 57

HOUSE BILL NO. 2529

AN ACT to amend Chapter 87 of the Private Acts of 1985; and any other acts amendatory thereto, relative to the charter of the City of Germantown.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Chapter 87 of the Private Acts of 1985, and any other amendatory acts thereto, is amended by deleting Section 6.01 in its entirety and by substituting instead the following language:

The City Attorney shall be an attorney at law entitled to practice in the courts of the State of Tennessee.

SECTION 2. This act shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the City of Germantown Board of Mayor and Aldermen. Its approval or nonapproval shall be proclaimed by the Mayor of the City of Germantown and certified to the secretary of state.

SECTION 3. For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this act, it shall be effective upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes, it shall become effective as provided in Section 2.


