AN ACT to authorize an advisory referendum relative to funding for public school renovation in Metropolitan Lynchburg, Moore County.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. The Metropolitan Council of the Metropolitan Government of Lynchburg, Moore County, Tennessee, may, by resolution, direct the county election commission to conduct an advisory, non-binding referendum of the voters of Metropolitan Lynchburg, Moore County. Such referendum shall be conducted concurrently with the upcoming presidential preference primary election in 2016, and the question on the ballot of such election shall be substantially as follows:

The following question is for advisory purposes only. No legal effect shall result from the adoption or rejection of such provisions.

Do you desire the Metropolitan Council of the Metropolitan Government of Lynchburg, Moore County, Tennessee, to issue a \$13,000,000, twenty-five year debt issue to be funded with a thirty-seven cent (37¢) increase on the county property tax levy? The proceeds of the debt issue will be used exclusively to fund public school renovation costs of the Metropolitan Lynch, Moore County School System.

SECTION 2. This act shall have no effect unless it is approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the legislative body of the Metropolitan Government of Lynchburg, Moore County. Its approval or nonapproval shall be proclaimed by the presiding officer of the legislative body and certified to the secretary of state.


SECTION 3. For the purpose of approving or rejecting the provisions of this act, it shall be effective upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it. For all other purposes, it shall become effective as provided in Section 2.


