AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 4; Title 9 and Title 58, relative to security enhancements at national guard facilities.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "National Guard Force Protection Act of 2016".

SECTION 2. The department of military may implement the following force protection enhancements at national guard facilities:

- (1) Aiphones;
- (2) Shatter resistant films;
- (3) Cameras;
- (4) Magnetic locks with keypads;
- (5) Mobile ballistic shields;
- (6) Barriers, including:
 - (A) Permanent bollards;
 - (B) Automatic bollards;
 - (C) Manual removable bollards; and
 - (D) Decorative barriers;
- (7) Privacy screens; and
- (8) Any other force protection enhancement deemed necessary by the department.

SECTION 3. The adjutant general shall inform the general assembly upon completion of the force protection enhancements required pursuant to this act.

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SECTION 4. This act shall not be construed to be an appropriation of funds, and no funds shall be obligated or expended pursuant to this act unless the funds are specifically appropriated by the general appropriations act.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law, the public welfare requiring it.
