AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 55, relative to medium speed vehicles.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF TENNESSEE:

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 55-1-125, is amended by deleting the language "whose top speed is greater than thirty miles per hour (30 mph) but not greater than thirty-five miles per hour (35 mph)" and substituting instead the language "whose top speed is greater than thirty miles per hour (30 mph), but whose maximum speed allowed is thirty-five miles per hour (35 mph) only on streets with a forty mile per hour (40 mph) or less posted speed limit pursuant to § 55-8-191(b)(1),".

SECTION 2. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 55-8-101(32), is amended by deleting the language "whose top speed is greater than thirty miles per hour (30 mph) but not more than thirty-five miles per hour (35 mph)" and substituting instead the language "whose top speed is greater than thirty miles per hour (30 mph), but whose maximum speed allowed is thirty-five miles per hour (35 mph) only on streets with a forty mile per hour (40 mph) or less posted speed limit pursuant to § 55-8-191(b)(1),".

SECTION 3. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 55-50-102(35), is amended by deleting the language "whose top speed is greater than thirty miles per hour (30 mph) but not greater than thirty-five miles per hour (35 mph)" and substituting instead the language "whose top speed is greater than thirty miles per hour (30 mph), but whose maximum speed allowed is thirty-five miles per hour (35 mph) only on streets with a forty mile per hour (40 mph) or less posted speed limit pursuant to § 55-8-191(b)(1),".

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2016, the public welfare requiring it.
