State Election Commission Meeting
October 10, 2011

The State Election Commission meeting was called to order by Chairman Judy Blackburn at NOON, Central Daylight Time, October 10, 2011. The following members and staff were present: Chairman Blackburn; Commissioners DuBois, Head, Wallace and Wheeler, Assistant Coordinator of Elections Beth Henry Robertson; AES, Systems Administrator and Kathy Summers, Elections Specialist.

Motion was made, seconded and unanimously approved to adopt the minutes from:

- August 8, 2011 - regularly scheduled meeting
- September 21, 2011 – telephonic meeting

Pursuant to T.C.A. § § 2-12-101 and 2-12-106, motion was made, seconded and unanimously approved to accept the nominations for county election commission appointments as submitted and to leave the nomination process open until 4:30 p.m., Central Daylight Time, October 10, 2011. (No appointments were made.)

Old Business

- Software Vendor Certification Process Currently Used in TN - Steve Griffy, AES - System Administrator discussed the process used for certifying software vendors in Tennessee. Mr. Griffy also provided commission members the list of approved software vendors and a list of vendors currently used in Tennessee. (See attached lists.)

Motion was made, seconded and unanimously approved to have Coordinator Goins and Steve Griffy to come up with a recommendation for certification process by the December 2011, State Election Commission meeting.

New Business

- Viewing of voting machines in Jackson County, Indiana. Unisyn has requested the State Election Commission and Coordinator view their recently certified voting machine in Jackson County, Indiana. The machine to be viewed has been certified to the 2005 Voluntary Voting Systems Guidelines (2005 VSG) and has been issued an EAC Certification Number. (See attached letter supplied by Unisyn.)


Coordinator Update – given by Beth Henry Robertson

- November 1, 2011 – All ninety – five (95) counties will participate in an ongoing effort to inform voters about the new law requiring voters to show valid photo identification when voting. Town Hall formats will vary from county to county but should allow voters to ask questions about the new law.
- The Coordinator’s office has started issuing petitions for Delegates and Presidential candidates.
- Beginning January 1, 2012, voter registration files will be read against Safety files to identifying illegal alien.

The meeting for November 7th is canceled. The December meeting will be rescheduled to coincide when Secretary of State, Tre Hargett’s certification of nationally-recognized presidential candidates to the State Election Commission. Secretary Hargett is to have this task completed by 12:00 – NOON, December 6, 2011.

Motion was made to adjourn, and there being no further business to come before the commission at this time, the meeting was adjourned.

**Electoral/Voter Registration Systems Vendor Procedures for Certification
by the State Coordinator of Elections**

October 1, 1997

The State of Tennessee's Coordinator of Elections certifies, as required by state law, computerized electoral/voter registration systems. All systems and vendors must receive certification from the Coordinator of Elections before the system may be sold in the State of Tennessee. These systems include, but may not be limited to, voter registration management and election management. In order for a vendor to be considered for certification, the vendor must provide evidence to the Coordinator of Elections as specified below.

First Step:

Any interested vendor should submit a written request to the Coordinator of Elections requesting certification of your company and system. Included with the request will be documentation to support the company and the system.

I. Vendor Documentation

The vendor must supply background information concerning the parent company. This information must be presented to the Coordinator of Elections in written form. The document submitted must include the information outlined below as minimal.

A. Company Overview

1. Description
2. Form of Business - sole proprietor, partnership, corporation, etc.
3. Office locations
4. Size/type of staff
5. Products and services offered
6. Financial report

B. Client Base

1. Estimated number of clients served in the last 10 years
2. List of 5 client referrals (other than electoral system, if applicable)

II. System Documentation

The vendor must supply information concerning the electoral system. This information must be presented to the Coordinator of Elections in written form. The document submitted must include the information outlined below as minimal.

- A. Years in production
- B. Growth of the system
- C. Functions performed by the system
- D. Number of installations in production
- E. Support staff provided for installation and support
- F. Hardware and software requirements
- G. List of 3 client referrals for the electoral/voter registration system

**Electoral/Voter Registration Systems Vendor Procedures for Certification
by the State Coordinator of Elections**

October 1, 1997

Second Step:

Following receipt of the certification request, an electoral system specification manual will be issued to the vendor and preparations for a system demonstration will begin.

I. Demonstration

A demonstration of the system must be performed. The system is expected to minimally perform to the specifications outlined in the Electoral System Specifications Manual. Additional functions not outlined in the manual may be demonstrated. The Coordinator of Elections, Elections System Administrator and a County Administrator of Elections must be present at the demonstration. The demonstration should be held in an office or conference room within or near the office of the Coordinator of Elections. Requests for alternate locations must be approved by the Coordinator of Elections.

II. Acceptance

The vendor will be notified in writing of certification. In the event that the vendor's system is not certified, documentation will be supplied to the vendor outlining system deficiencies. Any vendors not certified may request another demonstration. The request for another demonstration may be accepted at the discretion of the Coordinator of Elections. A vendor's status is considered certified or not certified. Categories of pending or partial certification do not exist.

Third Step:

Once a vendor has been certified, all actual purchasing decisions are made by the individual counties rather than the state government.

Fourth Step:

I. Required Revisions

Certification criteria will require modification due to Federal or State Legislative decisions. The new certification criterion is mailed to the vendor or proprietor of the certified systems. Vendors are not required to reapply for certification but are expected to make the appropriate system modifications for all locations within in a reasonable amount of time. Vendors will submit documentation of the changes to their system and the dates the counties will be updated. The Coordinator of Elections office will contact counties to confirm the update to the system.

II. Evaluations

Voter Registration systems in use throughout the State of Tennessee will be periodically evaluated to insure compliance to the certification specification requirements and insure continued service and support is maintained to assist County Election Commission offices to perform the system functions defined by the documentation (original and updates) of the system.

Dear Mr. Goins:

We hope this letter finds you well. Much has occurred with Unisyn since we last spoke at the summer conference. We are currently certified in the States of Indiana, Missouri, Virginia and Mississippi (EAC certification not required in Mississippi). We have customers in Indiana, Missouri and Mississippi using our new system or portions of it. We ran successful elections in two Virginia counties on August 23, 2011, as part of the certification process and presently we have applied for certification in the States of Iowa, Ohio and Texas.

In addition, we were granted an enhanced EAC certification due to Virginia requirements regarding the reporting and management of write in votes. This EAC certification was issued on July 21, 2011. Currently we have another version release being tested by Wyle which certification is expected to be granted by the EAC in late October 2011.

As a result of our good fortune and acceptance in the market place, this letter is a formal request to you and the State Election Commission requesting certification in the State of Tennessee of the Unisyn Voting Solutions, Inc., a subsidiary of ILTS, OpenElect Voting System. As you know, we received certification federally by the Election Assistance Commission under the 2005 Voluntary Voting System Guidelines (2005 VVSG) with the EAC Certification Numbers: UNS10121966-OE, Date Issued: January 13, 2010, and the enhanced certification UNS10121966-OE-WI, issued on July 21, 2011.

A current financial report is enclosed with this letter, as well as a list below of the jurisdictions that are using our voting systems and a list of the sales representatives under contract to sell and support our systems in their respective territory.

Unisyn requests an opportunity to demonstrate our 2005 EAC certified products at your October 10, 2011, State Election Board of Commissioners' meeting. We would also like to discuss a potential jurisdiction that you and the Commissioners can visit in November of 2011 to view the system in use.

PROCEDURES FOR CERTIFYING VOTING MACHINES BY THE TENNESSEE STATE ELECTION COMMISSION

All voting machines/vendors must receive certification from the state election commission and the coordinator of elections before any voting machines or systems may be sold in the State of Tennessee.

First Step:

Any interested vendor should submit a written request to the coordinator of elections and the state election commission requesting certification of your company together with the EAC certification number, a financial report and a list of all states that have already bought your voting machines or systems. If you would like to demonstrate your product at a meeting of the state election commission, please make that request in your letter. You will be notified of the date, time, and place of the meeting where you may make your presentation.

Second Step:

A. Voting Machine Procedure

Following verification of EAC certification and an initial presentation of your product and/or services, you would need to arrange for at least two (2) State Election Commissioners (of opposite parties) and the coordinator of elections (or designee) to view your machines or system in use in an election of a substantial size in another state. An election of a substantial size involves at the minimum the following characteristics:

- The jurisdiction has a population of at least 25,000 persons;
- The jurisdiction has at least two (2) or more district races on the ballots; and
- There are at least two (2) contested races involving both at large and district races on the ballot.

B. Voting Machine Software Systems Upgrade

- EAC Certification;
- Presentation of software upgrade before State Election Commission at a monthly meeting; and
- Viewing of upgrade in another state (In lieu of viewing machine in another state, at the discretion of the State Election Commission, letters of recommendation from users in other jurisdiction may be used as support for approval.)

Third Step:

The State Election Commission must vote to certify the machine in order for the machines to be used in an election in Tennessee.

If you have any further questions regarding certification of your company, please feel free to contact the office of the state election coordinator at the phone number listed above.

Beginning January 1, 2012, all voters must present an ID, meeting the requirements below, containing the voter's name and photograph, whether voting early or on Election Day. These requirements DO NOT apply to elections in 2011.

What form of photo ID do I need to bring?

- Tennessee driver's license with your photo,
- United States Passport,
- Department of Safety photo ID,
- Photo ID issued by the federal or state government,
- United States Military photo ID, or
- Gun permit card with your photo

What forms of photo ID are NOT acceptable?

- A college student photo ID
- A photo ID not issued by the federal or state government

Who is exempt?

- Voters who vote absentee by mail. (View requirements to vote absentee at <http://www.tn.gov/sos/election/bymail.htm>)
- Voters who are residents in a licensed nursing home or assisted living center and who vote at the facility
- Voters who are hospitalized
- Voters with a religious objection to being photographed
- Voters who are indigent and unable to obtain a photo ID without paying a fee

What if I don't bring a photo ID to the polling place?

- If you do not bring a photo ID and you are not exempt (see above exemptions), you must vote with a provisional ballot.
- You will then have two (2) business days after the election to return to the county election commission office to show a valid photo ID.

What if I don't have a photo ID?

- You may obtain a free photo ID from the Tennessee Department of Safety.
