# EXECUTIVE ORDER

BY THE GOVERNOR

No. 38

## AN ORDER ESTABLISHING THE TENNESSEE COUNCIL FOR INTERSTATE ADULT OFFENDER SUPERVISION

**WHEREAS**, the Interstate Compact for Adult Offender Supervision regulates the transfer and supervision of parolees and probationers across state lines; and

**WHEREAS**, the Interstate Compact provides community protection and promotes rehabilitation by monitoring the interstate travel and supervision of parolees and probationers; and

**WHEREAS**, Tennessee has participated in the Interstate Compact since 1939 pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated, §§ 40-28-401, *et seq.*; and

**AND WHEREAS**, a state Council for Interstate Adult Offender Supervision is required by the Interstate Compact, and Tennessee Code Annotated, § 40-28-402, directs the Governor to establish its initial composition by executive order;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Don Sundquist, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Tennessee, do hereby order and direct the following:

- (1) There is hereby established the Tennessee Council for Interstate Adult Offender Supervision.
- (2) The Council shall be comprised of seven (7) members to be appointed as follows:
  - (a) The following two (2) members will serve on the Council by virtue of their positions:
    1. The Commissioner of the Department of Correction, or his/her designee
    2. The Compact Administrator for the State of Tennessee
  - (b) The following five (5) members will serve on the Council for three-year terms:
    1. One (1) member representing the Tennessee Judiciary to be appointed by the Chief Justice of the Tennessee Supreme Court
    2. One (1) member representing the Tennessee General Assembly to be appointed jointly by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Speaker of the Senate

3. One (1) member representing victims' rights groups, to be appointed by the Governor
  4. One (1) attorney involved in the criminal justice system, to be appointed by the Governor
  5. One (1) member of the Tennessee Board of Probation and Parole, to be appointed by the Governor
- (c) The five (5) appointed members may serve no more than two (2) consecutive terms with initial appointments staggered as follows:
1. The legislative and judicial members will each serve an initial one (1) year term.
  2. The Board member will serve an initial two (2) year term.
  3. The attorney and victims' rights members will each serve an initial three (3) year term.
- (3) Members of the Council shall be appointed on a nonpartisan basis and shall reflect the diversity of Tennessee.
- (4) In the event a vacancy occurs on the Council, a replacement shall be appointed, as provided above, to serve the balance of the unexpired term.
- (5) Members of the Council shall receive no compensation for such service but may be reimbursed for expenses in accordance with the provisions of the comprehensive travel regulations, as promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration and approved by the Attorney General.
