Dear Richard:

Please be advised that pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-5-215, the Joint Government Operations Committee voted on October 10, 2007, to stay the running of the seventy-five-day period required by § 4-5-207 for the proposed permanent rules of the Human Rights Commission. These rules were filed in the Office of the Secretary of State in August, 2007 and were to take effect October 23, 2007. They are as follows:

The Joint Government Operations Committee voted to stay for forty-five (45) days the running of the seventy-five-day period required by § 4-5-207 for the proposed rules listed above.
