CHAPTER 0080-4-10  
STANDARDS FOR GOOD MANUFACTURING PRACTICES

Presented herein are proposed rules of the Tennessee Department of Agriculture submitted pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 4-5-202 in lieu of a rulemaking hearing. It is the intent of the Tennessee Department of Agriculture to promulgate these rules without a rulemaking hearing unless a petition requesting such hearing is filed within thirty (30) days of the publication date of the issue of the Tennessee Administrative Register in which the proposed amendments are published. Such petition to be effective must be filed in the Commissioner's office located in the Moss Building, Ellington Agricultural Center, Hogan Road, Nashville, TN 37220, and in the Administrative Procedures Division of the Department of State, Fifth Floor, James K. Polk State Office Building, Sixth and Deaderick, Nashville, TN 37219, and must be signed by twenty-five (25) persons who will be affected by the rule, or submitted by a municipality which will be affected by the rule, or an association of twenty-five (25) or more members, or any standing committee of the general assembly. The text of the proposed rules is as follows:

(b) 29 CFR 110 (B) at 51 FR 24475 as amended at 54 FR 24892.

(c) 29 CFR 110 (C) at 51 FR 24475.

(d) 29 CFR 110 (E) at 51 FR 24475.




