This rule change will increase the total number of hunting and fishing licenses sold by approximately 900 license agents across the state. Agents collect \$.50 for selling a trip license or \$1.00 for an annual license.

Persons most affected are fishermen and young nonresident hunters. Fishermen are in favor of these changes which add options for one-day licenses. We have also heard from the parents and grandparents of young nonresident hunters who are in favor of a lower-cost option for deer hunting. Some fishermen in upper east Tennessee are interested in the South Holston Lake license, but most of the lake is in Tennessee so there is not a lot of additional fishing opportunity for Tennessee residents.

For the Resident One-day All-fish license, we anticipate selling 40,000-50,000 licenses per year, but will there will be fewer sales of the annual trout license, for total revenue of \$300,000 - \$400,000 per year. For the Nonresident One-day licenses (2 types), we expect many buyers will switch from the current 3-day licenses to the new 1-day licenses, but there will be additional buyers resulting in approximately breaking even. For the nonresident Junior All-game licenses, we will lose money on the juveniles that would have bought the adult license, but anticipate selling more Junior licenses and selling licenses to adults that will accompany the juveniles resulting in approximately breaking even. For the South Holston license, Virginia will send Tennessee the revenue they receive for license sales to their residents and Tennessee will reciprocate. Overall we anticipate generating less than \$500,000 in new revenue but we will increase the total number of license buyers.

For the South Holston license, Virginia will send Tennessee the revenue they receive for license sales to their residents and Tennessee will reciprocate. Overall we anticipate generating less than \$500,000 in new revenue but we will increase the total number of license buyers.
