**ORDER GRANTING CANCELLATION OF AUTHORITY
TO PROVIDE RESOLD TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES**

This matter came before Vice Chair Kenneth C. Hill, Commissioner Herbert H. Hilliard, and Commissioner David Jones of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (the "Commission" or "TPUC"), the voting panel assigned to this docket, during a regularly scheduled Commission Conference held on May 20, 2019. Access Fiber Group, Inc. ("AFG" or the "Company") was granted authority to provide operator services and/or resell telecommunications by the Tennessee Public Utility Commission ("Commission"), on July 15, 2008 in Docket No. 08-00044.

The surrender of Access Fiber's CCN was made in connection with the *Pro Forma* consolidation described in Docket No. 18-00118, whereby Access Fiber was consolidated into one of its affiliate companies, Crown Castle Fiber, LLC. Both Access Fiber and Crown Castle Fiber have previously elected to operate pursuant to the Market Regulation Act.¹ The consolidation was completed on December 31, 2018. On February 5, 2019, the Commission received a notice of consummation and request to surrender the certificate of public convenience and necessity ("CCN") granted to Access Fiber. In response to a Commission inquiry, in a letter

dated February 12, 2019, AT&T Tennessee stated it is not providing any resold lines or facilities to Access Fiber at this time.

Based upon careful consideration of the entire record in this matter, the Commissioners voted unanimously to grant the Company's request to cancel its authority.
