**NOTICE OF APPROVAL OF INTERCONNECTION AGREEMENT**



This Interconnection Agreement (the "Agreement") negotiated between BellSouth Telecommunications, LLC d/b/a AT&T Tennessee and New Horizons Communications Corp. was filed with the Tennessee Regulatory Authority<sup>1</sup> (the "Commission") on February 9, 2017.<sup>2</sup> The Agreement was negotiated pursuant to 47 U.S.C. §§ 251 and 252. The Agreement has been reviewed, and no portion discriminates against a telecommunications carrier that is not a party to the Agreement.

A Notice was filed by the Commission on April 18, 2017 advising that the Agreement would be deemed approved by the Commission within ten business days of the filing of the Notice unless an objection to the Agreement was filed with the Commission. No objection to the Agreement has been received by the Commission.

Pursuant to the Notice and absent any objection having been filed with the Commission, the Agreement is approved effective as of May 2, 2017.
