Among other things, the Commission's Order of March 31st in this Docket required all Tennessee jurisdictional utilities to submit a report within thirty days describing any temporary grace period, payment plans, and other options that will be implemented or will continue following the expiration or lifting of the public health emergency declaration. Please consider this letter as B&W Pipeline, LLC (B&W's) report as required by the Commission's Order.

At this time, all of our customer's accounts are current, and there has been no need for any special adjustments to our standard billing or operating procedures required because of the Covid-19 outbreak. As a result, B&W expects to return to its regular billing and operating procedures upon the expiration or lifting of the public health emergency declaration.
