Mrs. Sarah Nenny.

At Russellville, Tenn., February 16, 1889, Mrs. Sarah Nenny, a mother in Israel went to her long-wished-for home. She had for years greatly desired to depart and be at rest, but was reconciled to await her dear Saviour's will.

Mrs. Nenny was born in Greene county, Tenn., October 18, 1808. Her father was James Galbreath, of Mecklinburg, Pa. Her mother was Nellie Martin, of Pennsylvania. She was married October 2, 1839, to Charles P. Nenny, who died January 12, 1857, an elder of the Bethesda Presbyterian church, Cheek's Cross-roads, Tenn. She was of Presbyterian extraction. Mrs. Nenny was an ardent Presbyterian, but far better a true Christian. She was long a member of the Bethesda church, an old and important organization in Jefferson county, and which has Gleason Blackburn, Father Mc-Campbell, Nathaniel Hood, Robert Glenn and other shining names Presbyterianism. From of past ten years she has been a member of the Bethesda church, and during the death, temporarily died out during the organization. Mr. Nenny was not willing to live outside of church organization. The way was not enough to revive the old church, and mainly his organization at Russellville, Miss. G. church was organized of herself, her son, Charles, 1876, consisting of herself, her son, Charles, Nenny, and a few others yet surviving. Here she continued to worship as long as, with assistance, she was able to get to the church. She kept abreast with the religious literature of the day, and had been a subscriber for more than forty years. She was eminently a woman of prayer, and saw all of her children, and an of all of her grandchildren of the age of perhaps all of her grandchildren of the age of accountability, fathered into the Church, and accounted. She gave of her substance, and hung in her family to give, for the support of the Gospel, aged and feeble, her death at the time was unexpected. She was up, eating her supper, when the summons came. But she had well heeded her Saviour's command, "Man ye therefore ready also, for the Son of man cometh at an hour when ye think not." Her counsel at her death was, "I had only come to rest, but she has only gone before."
