





### MEMORIAL.

MRS. SARAH A. HARRISON,

born in the State of N. C., in 1829, professed religion in her 13th year, and joined the Methodist Episcopal church when she was about 15 years old. She with her father, Mr. E. S. Clark, who was so long and favorably known in this community as an honest and pious citizen, a pillar in his church, together with the family moved from North Carolina to Blount county and afterwards to Roane county, of this State, locating in Loudon. Sometime in the year of 1855, she was married to D. F. Harrison, who also occupied an honorable place in the esteem of those who knew him, and also was one upon whose shoulders the stay of his church found a resting place. He built almost entirely out of his own limited means the present M. E. church at this place. She having been thus religiously connected opportunity was given her to devote a well rounded, perfect christian character, which she did completely.

We believe that Grandma Harrison was in this community esteemed as highly as an humble, conscientious christian as it is the privilege of God's people to be esteemed. She was ever ready to visit the sick and afflicted, and alleviate their suffering and distress in every way. It was her greatest pleasure to attend all means of grace when well, and at the hour she was accustomed to return from worship, God called her from us. She was a sufferer for nearly seven months. Her last hours passed away quietly July 28th, 1905.

She was the mother of six children, two only of whom reached adult life. Virginia and Charles. Virginia was the first wife of W. H. Harrison, and mother of three children, who were given their earlier training by their grandmother who took charge of them even before their mother died. It was during this benevolent work of hers that the writer had the best opportunity for an opinion of her christian character. She leaves behind a son, a son-in-law, three grand-children, six sisters, one brother, and a large circle of relatives and friends to mourn her death. But in laying her beside her departed husband, daughter and other relatives, we did so with a fixed hope, that when God's chosen are risen from the dead, she will be one of the number whose inheritance is in a mansion not made with hands, but prepared by her Savior in Heaven.
