Death of Mrs. Mary Henry.

The home of our fellow-townsmen, T. M. Henry, is made sad by the death of his beloved wife, Mary Pope Henry, which occurred Wednesday, July 6, 1887; the hearts of her children are drinking deep at sorrow's fountain, and this entire community feel strangely bereft on account of this sad dispensation. She was born April 27, 1842, and was united in holy wedlock to T. M. Henry, Nov. 3, 1863—Rev. S. D. Ogburn officiating. Since that event she has lived in our town. Her life is a living panorama, so beautiful, so good, that we would miss its portrayal if an attempt were made, as far as we would in an effort

"To gild refined gold, to paint the lily,
To throw a perfume on the violet,
To smooth the ice, or add another hue
Unto the rainbow, or with taper-light
To seek the beauteous eye of heaven to
garnish."

First to the cell of distress, sickness and sorrow; last at the grave of the poor and needy. Her life study was that of helping burdened hearts, and in this she never failed. What a magnificent monument to one's name. What an example. It will live until moon shall wax and wane no more.

Her funeral was preached at the Methodist church last Thursday, by Rev. R. J. Craig, assisted by Rev. S. D. Ogburn. Her venerable father, J. J. Pope, of Kentucky, and all his living children were present. The church was filled to its capacity, and the flower designs which covered her casket—contributions from friends who appreciated her—were beautiful tributes to her memory. This entire community is in deep sympathy with the bereaved family.

To MRS. MOLLIE PIKE, one of the town's loveliest ladies, this column pays homage for ninety years of gracious living. Her birthday anniversary was celebrated at a beautifully planned party given Thursday afternoon by her sister, MRS. MINNIE ROSS, at the home of ELLA MOCRE. A beautiful big birthday cake, ablaze with lighted candles, was the cynosure of all eyes when the guests gathered in the dining room where a delightful salad course was served and where the honoree opened the attractive presents presented her.
