





Called Home.

Mrs. Lula Justice, wife of the Hon. Joseph E. Justice, of Ashland City, died on Saturday, Dec., the 31, 1901, and was buried at the Lenox Graveyard on Sunday following. Funeral services were conducted at the Methodist Church of this place, by the Rev. B. T. Lannon, followed by a short ceremony at the grave.

Mrs. Justice was seized with an attack of pneumonia, on Christmas day, and in spite of all the assistance of the best medical skill and careful attention, she grew steadily worse as the days passed until death relieved her sufferings. She was in the 36th year of her age, and was the daughter of the Hon. J. J. Lenox and Harriet C. Lenox of this place, and with the exception of about two years spent in Texas, immediately after her marriage, she was a lifelong resident of Ashland City.

She leaves Three little children, two girls and one boy, the oldest being only about 6 years of age.

Mrs. Justice was a member of the Methodist Church, and had been ever since she was thirteen years old; She was a lady of high culture, intelligence, and refinement, and her death was a shock to this community in which she was universally respected and beloved.

She was a most devoted and affectionate wife, and mother, and her loss to her family circle is one that can never be replaced.

Never in our experience have we witnessed such sincere and universal grief as was manifested at the funeral of this good woman, who has lived her life so quietly, and unselfishly, but, has so indelibly impressed her beautiful personality upon the hearts of this people who have known her since she was born.

We speak for a large circle of friends and acquaintances, when we tender our sincere condolence to the husband, the father and mother, the brothers and sisters, and the large family circle, bereaved by this sad calamity; and to the little children, now too young to fully realize their great loss, we trust that time which will show, may also temper this misfortune to their lives, and that their mother may live for them in the hearts of her friends, and that all may join her in that reunion which shall be without the shadow of another parting.

Mrs. Carroll was born in Cheat-ham county, daughter of James E. and Ann Hiland Justice. She spent most of her life in Dickson county. She moved to Nashville 14 years ago upon the death of her husband, W. H. Carroll. She had lived with Mrs. Hagewood since that time.

She was married to Mr. Carroll in 1903, several years after the death of her first husband, John J. Bell.

Mrs. Carroll was a member of the Church of Christ.

Besides her daughter, she is survived by seven stepdaughters, Mrs. Biscoe Griffith, Mrs. Lillie Aylor, Mrs. E. C. Martin, Mrs. Ora Lynch, Mrs. Artie Gamble, Mrs. Beulah Hooper, all of Nashville, and Mrs. W. S. Jarman, Fosterville, Tenn.; three stepsons, Emmett Bell and T. D. Bell of Nashville, and Owen Carroll of Neptune, Tenn.; five grandsons and three great-grandsons.
