... sound speech, that cannot be condemned; that he that is of the contrary part may be ashamed, having no evil thing to say of you.
... Exhort servants to be obedient unto their own masters, and to please them well in all things; not answering again;
... Not purloining, but showing all good fidelity; that they may adorn the doctrine of God our Saviour in all things.
... For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men,
... Teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world;
... Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ;
... Who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works.
... These things speak, and exhort, and reprove with all authority. Let no man despise thee.
CHAPTER III.
... Titus to get further directed by Paul, both concerning the things he should teach, and not teach. 10 He is willing also to reject schismatic heretics: 11 which done, he appointeth him both time and place, whither he should come unto him, and so concludes.
... them in mind to be subject to principalities and powers, to obey magistrates, to be ready to every good work.

... He rejoiceth to hear of the faith and love of Philemon, to whom he desireth to forgive his servant Onesimus, and longeth to receive him again.
PAUL, a prisoner of Jesus Christ, and Timothy our brother, unto Philemon our dearly beloved, and fellowlabourer,
... And to our beloved Apphia, and Archippus, our fellow-soldiers, and to the church in thy house:
... Grace to you, and peace, from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.
... I thank my God, making mention of thee always in my prayers,
... Hearing of thy love and faith, which thou hast toward the Lord Jesus, and toward all saints;
... That the communication of thy faith may become effectual by the acknowledg-

... To speak evil of
... but gentle, showing
... unto all men.
... For we ourselves also were
... foolish, disobedient, deceived, serv-
... versa lusts and pleasures, living in malice
... and envy, hateful, and hating one an-
... other.
... But after that the kindness and love of
... God our Saviour toward man appeared,
... Not by works of righteousness which
... we have done, but according to his mercy
... saved us, by the washing of regenera-
... tion, and renewing of the Holy Ghost;
... Which he shed on us abundantly
... through Jesus Christ our Saviour;
... That being justified by his grace, we
... should be made heirs according to the
... hope of eternal life.
... This is a faithful saying, and these
... things I will that thou affirm constantly,
... that they which have believed in God
... might be careful to maintain good works.
... These things are good and profitable unto
... men.
... But avoid foolish questions, and gene-
... alogies, and contentions, and strivings
... about the law; for they are unprofitable
... and vain.
... A man that is an heretick after the
... first and second admonition reject;
... Knowing that he that is such is sub-
... verted, and sinneth, being condemned of
... himself.
... When I shall send Artemas unto thee,
... or Tychicus, be diligent to come unto me
... to Nicopolis: for I have determined there
... to winter.
... Bring Zenas the lawyer and Apollos
... on their journey diligently, that nothing
... be wanting unto them.
... And let our's also learn to maintain
... good works for necessary uses, that they
... be not unfruitful.
... All that are with me salute thee.
... Greet them that love us in the faith.
... Grace be with you all. Amen.
... It was written to Titus, ordained the
... first bishop of the church of the Cre-
... tians, from Nicopolis of Macedonia.

... of every good thing which is in you
... in Christ Jesus.
... For we have great joy and consolation
... in thy love, because the bowels of the
... saints are refreshed by thee, brother.

... bold in Christ to enjoin thee that which
