CHARLES BROOKS BROWN

Col. Charles Brooks Brown, passed quietly away at his home on East Main Street, Friday night at 9:30 o'clock, after an extended illness, he having suffered a heart attack some months ago. Pneumonia developed Wednesday, hastening his death.

Col. Brown was 73 years of age and moved to Gallatin from Wilson County, many years ago, and was one of the most widely known residents and business men of Gallatin.

His jolly good nature made for him many friends, both in business and private life. He affiliated with the civic organizations and was a willing and enthusiastic worker in anything for the betterment of his town and community. He was a successful business man and was active in business until his retirement several years ago.

He was a faithful member of the Presbyterian church.

Funeral services were conducted Sunday afternoon by his pastor, Rev. Charles Ramsay, and burial followed in the Gallatin cemetery.

A large gathering of sorrowing friends attended the last sad rites, and the beautiful floral tributes attested the esteem in which he was held.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Sallie Gray Brown, one daughter, Miss Nell Brown and one sister, Mrs. J. M. McClintock of DeValla Bluff, Ark.

DECEASED.

On Thursday morning, January 25, 1886, Willie Houston, wife of Charles E. Brown. The deceased was born March 14, 1860, and was married in November, 1883. She was the second child of William H. and Elizabeth Solomon, and the grand-daughter of the late Robert M. Boyers. She leaves one child, a girl six weeks of age. Her death was not expected until she had almost passed away, after a violent hemorrhage of the lungs.

The deceased was a woman of lovely character—a dutiful daughter, wife, mother and relative. With an industry that was ceaseless in its labor for the comfort and happiness of all around her, she was the sunshine of the household. With a temper that was sweet toward all, was united a vigorous and keen intellect that was masculine in strength. She was the only surviving child of Mrs. C. W. Boyers (formerly Mrs. W. H. Solomon) who is left "childless and crownless in her voiceless woe," and bereft of her only staff to lean on in her old age.

She was buried yesterday, in presence of many friends, and slept with the mantle of snow covering her grave. Brief religious services were held at the cemetery by Rev. Robert Gray.

Boyers, a loving husband and young baby to survive her. She was a young woman of noble qualities, and charitable to a fault. Her many virtues will live after her and she will be followed in death by kind remembrances from those of her many friends, with whom she was a great favorite. Her burial takes place to-morrow at the Gallatin cemetery, where Rev. Robt. Gray will administer the last sad rites.
