DEATH OF JOHN A. SHEPHERD.

ENIGMA, July 22.—On the morning of July 5 all that was mortal of John Augustine Shepherd passed away. He was born in Florence county, Va., May 11, 1849. He married Bettie M. Trousdale Nov. 15, 1876, professed religion Aug. 22, 1885, and joined the Cumberland Presbyterian church.

It could be heard on every side, and the eulogy is still passed upon him, that in the death of John Shepherd "we have lost a good man." He was a man beloved by all—a man of solidity and firmness; what he said he would do he did. But far above all, and the one thing that gave to us, his family and friends, the great consolation, was the fact that he fell asleep happy in Jesus. He died in great peace. Just a day or so before his demise he called his wife and four daughters, together with a few of his intimate friends, to his bedside and quoted this beatitude, "Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God." He told the family not to grieve after him; that he had done them all the good he could and was now ready and willing to go when the Master called him.

For years he was in the mercantile business here, lately being a member of the firm of R. L. Thompson & Co. He had held several positions of trust and honor—district assessor, school commissioner, postmaster, and was an elder in the Cumberland Presbyterian church.

On the forenoon of July 6, after a short yet delightful and impressive memorial service conducted by his pastor, Rev. C. K. Carlock, assisted by Rev. Carden of the M. E. church, his remains were tenderly laid to rest by sorrowing friends in the family burying ground.

To his wife and daughters we would say, "weep not as those who have no hope, for some happy day you will meet your husband and father in that bright world on high."
