## **INTRODUCTION**

The farm ledger of Samuel Lancelotte Richardson, Sr., 1936-1955, was loaned to the Tennessee State Library and Archives by Carol Kaplan for microfilming in April 2005. After filming the ledger was returned to the loaner.

Richardson was born July 10, 1902 and died November 18, 1993. He was the son of J. L. Richardson and Sallie Owen Johnston. Sallie Johnston's parents were Martha Ann Sangster and Lancelotte Johnston. Both families were founding members of Owen Chapel Church of Christ (see microfilm numbers 957 and 1765). Richardson served as elder and treasurer for the church almost his entire adult life, taking over from his grandfather and namesake, Lancelotte Johnston. Richardson worked for the Agriculture, Stabilization & Conservation Service, and owned a farm at 1005 Franklin Pike. His wife was Gladys Meadors, and their only child, Sam, Jr., died without heirs in 1988. Sallie J. Richardson's diary, kept as a young wife before Sam's birth, is located along with family histories at the Williamson County Archives.
